About STS

- Established in 1996
- Provides funding for commemorative projects
- \$3.5 million each financial year
- Two categories:
 - Community Grants: up to \$10,000
 - Major Grants: up to \$150,000
- Assessment in 3 batches
- Competitive process

Who can apply?

- Company
- Cooperative
- Corporate State or Territory Entity
- Incorporated Association
- Indigenous Corporation
- Local Government
- Non-corporate State or Territory Entity
- Non-corporate State or Territory Statutory Authority
- Statutory Entity
- Unincorporated Association grant activities up to \$10,000 only.

Eligible Projects

- Building a new memorial or restoring an existing memorial
- Displaying military artefacts and memorabilia
- Flagpoles
- Producing a documentary, podcast or publication
- Conducting an exhibition or educational activity
- Commemorative events to mark significant military anniversaries

Ineligible things

- Individuals or animals
- Formation or membership of an organisation
- Post-war experiences of service personnel
- Purchase of assets
- Catering
- Travel and accommodation costs
- Contingencies
- Reimbursement

Assessment Process

- Application assessed by DVA:
 - Responses to the selection criteria
 - Whether funding is for eligible items
 - How it compares to other applications in the batch
- Applications reviewed by the Commemorative Grants Advisory Committee (CGAC)
- Minister makes final funding decision

Selection criteria

- 1. Explain the importance of your project and how it commemorates the service and sacrifice of Australian service personnel
- 2. Demonstrate how your project is ready to proceed, and how you will deliver it
- 3. Demonstrate community/stakeholder support for your project

Supporting documentation

- Letters of support
- Quotes to support the funding sought
- Evidence of financial contributions from other parties

For publications and digital projects only

- A sample of previous works
- A content outline and/or sample chapter

Tips for applying

- Ensure your project is commemorative
- Address all sub-points of the selection criteria
- Get stakeholders in your community on board
- Only apply for things which are eligible
- Tick 'YES' to partial funding if appropriate for you
